FURTHER NOTES

Son of Patrick Geary (a Farmer) and Ellen Walsh. Rapidly promoted from Sergeant to Inspector and then Superintendent. Was dismissed on charges of Treason and taking bribes from the Clare IRA on 15th June 1928 by Commissioner Eoin O'Duffy. It is only 70 years later he was vindicated of this and his name cleared, after proof showed the IRA planted false intel on him. Geary emigrated to America and arrived in New York on 5th December 1928. Married Margaret Shryane on 8th February 1943 in New York. Served as a Tech Sergeant in the American military stationed in Britain during the Second World War. During his later life he actively involved in the IPA (International Police Association). Was awarded a Knighthood of the Holy Order of the Sepuchre of Jerusalem by the Papacy in Rome in 2000. Died on 14th October 2004, at the age of 104 years. he is buried in Calvary Cemetery in Woodside, Queens County, New York. The Tricolour displayed over the US House of Congress for his 100th Birthday is on display at St. John's Castle in Limerick. There is a book written about his life entitled 'On my honour – One man's lifelong struggle to clear his name' by William Geary and Brendon Colvert
