**FURTHER NOTES**

Thomas Joseph Watson was born in Graces Street in Nenagh, Co. Tipperary. He was the son of Henry Watson (a Labourer/Shopkeeper) and Bridget Mack. Served in 6th Battalion Dublin IRA Brigade. Married Mary Moran on 16th September 1923 in Cabinteely Church, Stillorgan. Was discharged on 13th March 1929. Became a Civil Servant and upon retirement resided in St. Anne's Deansgrange Road, Blackrock, Dublin. Died on 10th November 1966 in St. Michael's Hospital, Dun Laoghaire. He is buried in Deansgrange Cemetery (St. Brigid's Section). He has a file which can be ordered in advance and view in the National Archives of Ireland ( Reference DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE 2019/157/89 )
